

Widen the Road: Allowing All Immigrants Access to Driver Licenses Is a Win for Wisconsin



Allowing all immigrants to obtain driver licenses would positively benefit everyone in Wisconsin—children, families, communities, and the economy. So what would happen if all immigrants had access to driver licenses, without regard to immigration status?

Improving access to licenses would improve the well-being of Wisconsin children and families. An estimated **32,000 Wisconsin residents who are undocumented would get licenses** if barriers were removed. Of the undocumented residents who would get licenses, **14,000 live with children** and would be able to better care and provide for them.

A lack of access to driver's licenses is not limited to undocumented individuals. Low-income US citizens have also been affected by stringent laws that penalize those who do not have the funds to pay their traffic and parking tickets. In 2017, **56% of license suspensions were due to unpaid fines** rather than infractions related to unsafe driving. These harsh practices have disproportionately criminalized Black and Latinx drivers.
